**STEM Challenge:** Last week, the Year 6 pupils attended the STEM challenge at Mary Webb School. The day was hosted by Bloodhound, the company behind SSC, the British built supersonic car that currently holds the land-speed record.

The children were asked to complete a series of tasks, all based around the technology of the supersonic car, which culminated in them building their own car out of Knex. The children were required to record every step of this task and as a result of their teamwork, planning and methodical recording of ideas, they won a prize. The school team name will be added to the tail-fin of the Bloodhound SSC.
